Staffing Approach

The faculty of St. John the Evangelist School consists of more than 25 full-time and part-time educators. Of this number, we are fortunate to have six religious of the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (IHM). We have three administrative staff members who support our school as well as five aides.

St. John the Evangelist School strives to ensure that students receive the best instruction in all subjects with an emphasis in reading and mathematics. The school employs qualified part-time reading and math teachers in addition to the grade-level teachers. Inclusion specialists, computer and technology teachers, and a librarian also help students and faculty in integrating technology into the curriculum.

MEET OUR TEACHERS

Magrart Durney, Principal

Mrs. Durney received her BS from Washington Adventist University and her MS from the University of Maryland College. She is currently a doctoral candidate at Notre Dame of Maryland University, and she expects to receive her Ph.D. in Instructional Leadership in the fall of 2016. In addition to her formal course work, Mrs. Durney has attended seminars and learning workshops in effective teaching of common core subjects, teaching students with learning challenges, preparing and administering authentic alternative assessments, use of technology applications in the classroom, International Baccalaureate teaching, student database administration, and safety and security. She is a member of the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics.

Marilyn Whitney, Jr. Kindergarten

Mrs. Whitney graduated from Frostburg State University with a major in Political Science. She became our part-time primary reading and math teacher in 2008 and is currently the director of our junior kindergarten program. Mrs. Whitney has also taught kindergarten and grade 1 library, kindergarten art, and coordinated the school's marketing efforts.

Sister Doreen Willis, I.H.M., Kindergarten

Sister Doreen, our kindergarten teacher, joined St. John the Evangelist School in 1998. She has been teaching in the primary grades for more than 35 years and taught first grade for 27 years. She has a B.A. in Education with a minor in Special Education from Marywood University and an M.S. in Reading Education from Marywood University. Sister Doreen is also a certified reading specialist.

Mary Elizabeth Benko, First Grade

Ms. Benko joined our school faculty in 2010 and has worked as a Jr. K aide, as a small group reading and math teacher for 1st and 2nd grade, and as a 4th grade teacher. Currently, she teaches 1st grade. Ms. Benko earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Early Childhood Education from the University of Dayton.

Jean Engler, Second Grade

Mrs. Engler attended Indiana University of Pennsylvania and graduated with a B.S. in Special Education. She began teaching first grade here in the early 1980s and later became the primary grades reading and math teacher. In the mid-

1990s, she returned as a full-time second grade teacher, where she remains today. Mrs. Engler was St. John's Teacher of the Year in 2006 and has taught here for more than 25 years.

Christine Calabro, Third Grade

Mrs. Calabro graduated from the University of Maryland with a B.S. in Elementary Education. Certified in Maryland, she taught in Prince George's County, another Catholic school in the Archdiocese of Washington and a private school in Montgomery County before coming here in 2006. She has taught grades 2, 4, and 6 and was a reading resource teacher for Grades K-4. In 2009, Mrs. Calabro was elected St. John's Teacher of the Year.

Caitlin McNickle, Fourth Grade

Ms. McNickle attended Loyola University Maryland where she received her Bachelors of Art in Elementary Education with a minor in Special Education. She has had student teaching experiences from first grade to fifth grade in schools throughout Baltimore. She is a graduate of the Academy of the Holy Cross. Ms. McNickle joined our faculty in 2015.

Anna Davitt, Fifth Grade

Ms. Davitt attended James Madison University where she received her Bachelors of Science in Interdisciplinary Liberal Studies with a minor in Elementary Education. Ms. Davitt joined our faculty in 2014. She is the fifth grade homeroom teacher and also teaches sixth grade language arts.
